The University of South Alabama College of Nursing /Advanced Nursing Education Nurse Practitioner Residency Program in partnership with Coastal Family Health Center is accepting applications from Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioners (PMHNP) and Dual Role PMHNP/Family NPs at this time. The goal of the project is to improve nurse practitioner readiness to practice in behavioral health with a focus on improving access to quality healthcare for underserved rural and urban communities.



Application

- Applications for the 2023-2024 residency cohort are now being accepted. Four residents will be accepted for the 2023-2024 residency which will begin this Fall. Qualifications

- Recent graduates (within 18 months) from an accredited Master of Science in Nursing program, licensed in Mississippi before the start of residency, and board certified as a nurse practitioner.

Benefits

- The residency is a full-time, 12-month salaried position with benefits. The program format will include precepted experiences, specialty rotations, simulation experiences, and didactic training with opportunities for continued employment based on availability upon completion of the residency. This program will provide the skills, experience and confidence needed to launch your career as a nurse practitioner.
