# What is AdvancingPractice?

- ☐ One-year, paid training program for Family Nurse Practitioners (FNP), Pediatric Nurse Practitioners (PNP), Adult-Gerontology Nurse Practitioners (AGNP), and Certified Nurse Midwives (CNM)
- ☐ Partnership between Erie and UIC Nursing
  - Employed by Erie and patient care provided at Erie.
  - UIC Nursing supports curriculum and evaluation development.
- ☐ Primarily funded through a HRSA Grant



# What is AdvancingPractice?


- The fellowship prepares recently-graduated NPs and CNMs to become expert clinicians as well as nursing leaders in community health/primary care.
- ☐ Builds on nurse practitioner and nurse midwife academic programs.
- ☐ Located in Chicago, IL and Waukegan, IL.
- □ Currently recruiting for our sixth cohort.

### **Didactics**

- ☐ 3 hours per week, every Wednesday afternoon.
- ☐ Evidence-based, didactic learning sessions on clinical, leadership, and wellness topics.
- ☐ Didactic topics are chosen carefully by assessing the needs and experiences of the fellows.
- ☐ Continuously evolving to meet the Fellows needs.




### Quality Improvement and Leadership

- ☐ All Fellows participate in a QI Project.
- ☐ QI Projects are assigned based on both personal interest and organizational need.
- ☐ Completion of Institute of Healthcare Improvement Basic Certificate in Quality and Safety.



### Spanish Class


- ☐ All Fellows, regardless of fluency, will participate in Spanish Classes.
- ☐ Spanish Classes are provided through Instituto de Cervantes.





### Behavioral Health in Primary Care Certificate Program


- Between February through April didactics will be paused, and fellows will complete a Behavioral Health in Primary Care Certificate Course through UIC.
- ☐ Required and free for all fellows.
- ☐ In addition to certificate course, fellows will participate in Behavioral Health specialty clinics and didactics.

### Two Tracks for FNP Fellows

#### **Traditional**

- ☐ Traditional scope of FNP practice, caring for patients with an array of conditions during Continuity Clinic
- Work with preceptor of similar scope during Mentored Clinic
- Receive occasional maternal/ prenatal health expedience in Specialty Clinic

#### Maternal


- ☐ Includes caring for prenatal patients during Continuity Clinic
- Work with Midwife/OBGYN preceptor during Mentored Clinic
- ☐ Observe intrapartum/postpartum clinic at Northwestern Memorial Hospital



- ☐ Build relationships within your own cohort by having shared experiences.






## Work With Interprofessional Colleagues Who Support APRN Practice

- ☐ Along with other APRNs at Erie, Physicians and Physician Associates also serve as preceptors.
- Meet and work with learners from Erie's other medical training programs.
- ☐ Collaborate with administrative professionals and other departments within the organization to lead a QI project.
- ☐ Special presentations from other medical professionals from outside the organization.



### We are an Accredited Program!

- AdvancingPractice is an accredited APRN training program by the Consortium for Advanced Practice Providers. We became accredited in March 2023.
- ☐ During this process, the accreditation completed a two-day site visit to ensure that our program is meeting their required standards of a quality training program.






### Other Program Accomplishments

- ■We have successfully trained 31 APRN Fellows since 2020 and are currently training 8 more this year.
- ■20 out of the 31 fellows from previous cohorts accepted positions at Erie Family Health Centers post fellowship.
- Now offering two-year contract with Erie for employment after Fellowship year.







### Importance of APRN Fellowships

- Helps build and maintain APRN Workforce, especially in community health and primary care.
- Equipping newly graduated ARPNs with tools to avoid burn-out and thrive in their careers.
- ☐ Promotes collaborative among healthcare disciplines including physicians, PA's and behavioral health clinicians.




# What Happens Now?...



### Apply!

- Apply to be apart of the sixth cohort of AdvancingPractice!
- ☐ A PDF of our application is available to download on our website.
- Review the application early to ensure you have adequate time to review all application components and requirements.
- ☐ All applications are due on **February 2**<sup>nd</sup> **at 11:59pm CST.**
- ☐ Two rounds of interviews will take place between February and March.





### Requirements

- ✓ Recent graduates (March 2024 and May 2025) from an accredited NP (family, adult-gerontological primary care or pediatric primary care) or CNM program.
- ✓ Planning a career in community health working with diverse and under-resourced populations.
- ✓ Licensed and certified or certified-license pending upon admission to fellowship.
- ✓ Highly motivated to learn and speak Spanish through group provided training and independent study.
- ✓ Minimum GPA of 3.0
- ✓ Able to travel between all Erie sites.
- ✓ Able to start the program on September 8<sup>th</sup>, 2025.



### Important Notes to Remember...

- ☐ We pay our fellows 70% of market rate for APRNs in Chicago.
  - ☐ That equals \$73,500 for the fellowship year.
- ☐ Employment at Erie after the Fellowship is not guaranteed but the goal of our program is to build our workforce.
- ☐ Employment will be dependent on Fellow performance and well as organizational needs.



### Important Notes to Remember...

#### **Federal Loan Repayment Programs**

- ☐ If you are apart of a HRSA Loan Repayment Program...
  - You may be eligible to apply for the HRSA National Health Service Corp or Nurse Loan repayment program.
  - Both programs require you to be employed and as a licensed primary care clinician in eligible disciplines (this includes CNMs and APRN's).
  - In exchange for loan repayment, you serve at least two years of service at an NHSC-approved site in a Health Profession Shortage Area site.


