Dear Friends and Colleagues,

I can only start this year's annual letter from the Chairperson by stating the obvious: what a year! And as always, I have to immediately add "We couldn't have done this without all of you!". Never has it been more true. Never have I been more proud. In 2025, the Consortium directly supported, through accreditation, advocacy, membership and support of postgraduate training for Nurse Practitioners and Physician Assistants/Associates, the current and future healthcare workforce of this country, and thus the very health of our

communities for many decades to come. We remain fully committed to continuing to do that.

We have known from the beginning of this movement twenty years ago that this model of formal postgraduate training for NPs and PAs would make a significant contribution to preparing these individuals for the rigor and challenges of their roles as primary care providers, acute care specialists, psychiatric/MH providers and more. What we might not have anticipated is just how dire the healthcare workforce shortage would become over those years, and how absolutely critical the need for expert NPs and PAs in both primary care and specialty care would become, in both rural and urban areas. It is being felt across all demographics.

Thanks to our university partners who provide the foundational educational training of our future workforce, the organizations who develop and host postgraduate training programs in FQHCs, Veteran Affairs, academic medical centers, and other healthcare institutions, and the support both with knowledge and funding of multiple institutions both public and private, we have continued to grow and strengthen this movement.

I want to thank our Board of Directors for their strategic guidance, our Accreditation Commission for the enormous contribution of time and expertise they invest in assuring the depth and integrity of assessment of each program, and our unstoppable membership committee that works throughout the year to connect members, create programming, and of course—put on our annual conference.

We again thank the Moses/Weitzman Health System (MWHS) for providing all of the expert corporate services that make it possible for our small staff to operate as a world class organization with strength in communications, finance, technology, legal and other services that would be beyond the reach of the Consortium on its own.

By the numbers: As of the close of 2025, there are now 570 post-graduate residency and fellowship training programs for Advanced Practice Providers, both primary care and specialty focused. Of those, 276 are primary care focused and nearly half of these are in federally qualified health centers. The Consortium for Advanced Practice Providers now counts 1,291 alums of just its accredited programs and we predict continued growth based on the number of programs in the early pipeline for accreditation.

Our annual conference in Denver, Colorado, was a tremendous success, bringing together program leaders, faculty, practitioners, and advocates to engage in meaningful dialogue on program development, as well as key issues in policy, practice, research, and funding.

Thanks to the incredible leadership of our Executive Director Kerry Bamrick and her associate, Shay Etheridge, the Consortium is able to harness the talent of experts across the country who contribute their time and expertise—mostly on a volunteer basis—to make their contribution to delivering on the promise of the best health care for all people, through the best training for health care providers.

With the launch of 2026, we turn a page on the past and move forward with optimism. This work has never been easy! The obstacles have been many! But thanks to the determination and strength of all of our committed partners, we have joyfully moved forward and built an enduring approach to postgraduate training of the next generation of nurse practitioners and physician assistants/associates. When we undertake our strategic planning process in the Spring, we will be acutely aware of both the challenges and the opportunities before us—and of just how much the country is counting on us to continue to advance this work, and how eager we are to meet the challenges.

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Executive Director Report

As we begin 2026, I find myself reflecting on how far the Consortium for Advanced Practice Providers has come—and how much the national conversation about workforce, training, and healthcare delivery has evolved. What began as a small, nimble organization determined to set standards for postgraduate NP and PA education has become the leading voice and federally recognized accreditor for advanced practice postgraduate training in the United States.

This past year marked our **10-year anniversary** as a 501(c)(3), a milestone that allowed us to celebrate a decade of impact, growth, and innovation. Revisiting our earliest annual reports reminded me that while the healthcare landscape has changed dramatically, our mission and identity have remained remarkably consistent. We were founded on the belief that structured, high-quality postgraduate training strengthens the workforce and improves care for patients and communities. Ten years later, that belief is not only validated—it is nationally recognized.

The 2026 healthcare landscape is defined by tension and urgency. Workforce shortages have eased in some sectors but remain acute in many others. Health systems face increasing financial pressures. The complexity of patient needs continues to escalate, influenced by chronic disease trends, behavioral health crises, climate-related health events, and demographic shifts.

A few realities are shaping the year ahead:

- APPs remain essential in primary care, specialty medicine, behavioral health, acute care, and hospital-based roles. In many communities, care access hinges on NP and PA providers.
- Postgraduate training programs continue to expand, both in size and sophistication.
- Health systems increasingly see postgraduate APP training as a strategic necessity, not a luxury—critical to workforce stabilization, onboarding efficiency, and retention.
- APPs continue to shoulder a growing share of patient care, often managing complex, high-acuity cases.

This environment underscores the importance of the Consortium's work more than ever before.

The growth of postgraduate training programs in 2025 and now in early 2026 has been extraordinary. While exact numbers continue to evolve, programs are proliferating in nearly every state. Health systems, FQHCs, academic medical centers, rural networks, and specialty practices increasingly see structured APP postgraduate training as essential to practice readiness.

With this growth has come an increased demand for accreditation as the national marker of excellence. In 2025:

- The Consortium has accredited 45 programs, with many more in progress.
- Accreditation and reaccreditation applications reached record levels for the second consecutive year.
- The number of joint NP/PA postgraduate programs seeking accreditation continued to rise sharply.
- Our national roster of trained site visitors grew, and notably, more than one-third are alumni of accredited programs, demonstrating the lasting investment of graduates in the movement they helped build.

This affirmed what we have always believed: Accreditation is not the final step—it is the foundation. And we remain committed to supporting programs every step of the way.

It has also increased the responsibility we carry—to maintain rigor, consistency, and fairness, and to serve as a stabilizing presence for programs navigating evolving regulatory, workforce, and organizational pressures.

The three themes that members consistently use to describe the Consortium—Collaboration, Support, and Community—remain at the heart of how we operate.

As we look toward the next decade, the Consortium will continue:

- Advancing the national conversation about APP readiness, quality, and retention
- Supporting programs through accreditation, education, and community building
- Strengthening partnerships across healthcare systems, federal agencies, and professional organizations
- Championing the critical role APPs play in equitable, accessible, high-quality care

As I reread our earliest documentation this year, one sentence from our 2016 report resonated as strongly today as it did then:

"Our goal is to connect with members and accredited programs and advance postgraduate training as it achieves and maintains the highest standards of rigor and quality."

Ten years later, those words still define us.

To our members, program directors, faculty, trainees, alumni, site visitors, and colleagues—thank you. Your dedication is why the Consortium continues to thrive and why the movement we built together grows stronger each year.

Here's to a healthy, hopeful, and impactful 2026.

We look forward to all we will accomplish together.

2025 Updates

Accreditation:

10 Postgraduate APP training programs received initial accreditation, 5 programs received renewal of accreditation, and there are 24 programs in the accreditation pipeline for initial accreditation and 10 programs for renewal of accreditation in 2025. [Details on page 4-6.](#)

Membership and Membership Community Forums:

In 2025, our network of postgraduate NP, PA, and joint NP/PA residency and fellowship programs and professional grew and increased by 14% since 2024. The Consortium currently has 416 members across 48 states (numbers are from December Board Membership Meeting).

The Membership site, Community Forums, Resource Library, and Regional Membership Meetings provided a platform for our membership community to network, share resources, and collaborate on best practices, fostering innovation and growth within postgraduate training programs. Continuing in 2025, the Consortium hosted monthly Accreditation Office Hours, where postgraduate APP programs could ask questions, seek guidance, and gain insights into the accreditation process, ensuring continuous support and clarity for program success.

Eighth Annual Conference—“Navigating the Future: 20 Years of Sustaining Excellence in APP Postgraduate Training”

Our 2025 Conference was held July 13-15, 2025 in Denver, CO. New in 2025, we offered a Leadership Pre-Conference Workshop in addition to the Administration and Operations, and Preceptor Pre-Conference Workshops. Both the Pre-Conference Workshops and 2-day Conference were a major success! **Of the nearly 200 conference attendees, 99% of the evaluation respondents stated they were “strongly satisfied” or “satisfied” with all dimensions of the 8th Annual Conference.** [See story on page 7-11.](#)

Accreditation Activity in 2025

We continue to solidify our national position as the accreditor of postgraduate NP, PA and joint NP/PA residency and fellowship training programs. We serve the public and our stakeholders by accrediting these APP Postgraduate programs and publishing the outcomes of those reviews. We pride ourselves on the consistent quality of our professional yet collegial approach to ensuring a rigorous, voluntary, peer-review accreditation process.




